- working together internationally

art.2: principles - sovereign equality of all members

- obligation to fulfil the Charter's contents

no war, no force, no threat against other countriesprohibition of intervention in an inner conflict

Chapter II: - articles 3-6

- concerns membership (from how to get in to how to be expelled)

Chapter III: - articles 7-8

- lists the organs; confesses equality between men and women within the organization

Chapter IV: - articles 9-22

- describing the General Assembly (composition, function, powers, voting, procedure)

Chapter V: - articles 23-32

- about the Security Council (composition, function, powers, voting, procedure)

Chapter VI: - articles 33-38

- concerns the pacific settlement of disputes (obligates members to handle critical situations peacefully and to negotiate with the use of recommendations from the Security Council)

Chapter VII: - articles 39-51

- principles of what to do against threats to peace (Security Council decides whether military force

or/and economical measures to stop aggressions are necessary or not)

Chapter VIII: - articles 52-54

- regional arrangements to solve problems faster (Security Council allowed to build up agencies

around the world if necessary)

Chapter IX: - articles 55-60

- delivers information about the international economic and social co-operation (including the

human and fundamental rights issue)

Chapter X: - articles 61-72

- describing the Economic and Social Council (composition, function, powers, voting, procedure)

Chapter XI: - articles 73-74

- purposes and principles for the regions without own government (duty to report the General

Secretary about the development)

Chapter XII: - articles 75-85

- information about the international trusteeship system

Chapter XIII: - articles 86-91

- describing the Trusteeship Council (composition, function, powers, voting, procedure)

- describing the role of the International Supreme Court
